#### **Tardy Students:**

Be reminded that students may be at school at 8:20 a.m. Students entering the classroom after 8:45 a.m. are considered tardy and are subject to our tardy policies which include loss of recess and after school detentions.

#### When your child is absent or late...

Please, it is the parent's responsibility to call the office to report your child's absence each day they are gone from school. It is Illinois State Law. ### **Construction Project:**

Our construction is progressing very nicely at this time. The good weather that we have had has allowed all the foundation and floor to be poured for the addition. The iron came Friday, November 30th, and they should begin erecting the shell of the building during the first week in December.

The block layers have moved into our front hallway and have built the backside of the admin area. With this work being done visitors must walk down the gym and follow the signs to the office area.

The Geothermal Company has completed the drilling of all the wells. If you look at the geothermal field running adjacent to McClure Street you will notice many plastic pipes sticking up out of the ground. The company must now dig down by each set of pipes, connect the pipes together, and then cover them back up. Once completed our building will be heated and cooled through this "green" technology.

# **Child Safety Concerns:**

Student safety is our biggest concern with our parking lot. For your child's safety we have made it mandatory for cars to park both before and after school in a parking space. This allows your child to use the marked crosswalks to and from your vehicle. If parked along the North side of the parking lot your child can use the sidewalk that goes around our parking lot. We have already had some close calls with students walking behind cars. Please remind your children of the importance of walking down the crosswalks for their safety.

## **Bus Lane:**

Please be reminded that the driving lane along the south side of the parking lot is for buses only. Our buses run on very tight schedules district wide and they must be able to use the bus lane without other vehicles blocking it.

# Steele School Winter Playground Policy

We will go outside under these guidelines:

- If the temperature is 20 degrees or higher, or if the wind chill factor is not below 20 degrees
- When we have snow cover, students without boots will not be allowed off the blacktop area
- If your child should remain indoors due to an illness, you may send a note. If it is for an extended period of time, we reserve the right to ask for a doctor's note.
- Remember to wear your coat!

### **Box Tops:**

Our PTO collects Box Tops for education. During the month please submit your Box Top's with your child's name and classroom teacher labeled. ### **Early Dismissal:**

Wednesday, December 12<sup>th</sup> is the only early out day for the month of December. Please be reminded that students will be dismissed at 2:20 p.m on December 12th.

### **Holiday Parties:**

Holiday parties will be held Thursday, December  $20^{th}$ . We will begin our party activities with a sing along in the gym from 1:55-2:15, and then the students will go back to their classrooms for their party from 2:15-3:15.

#### Winter Break:

December 21<sup>st</sup> is the first day of Winter Break. This is a day for Teacher's Institute. Students will remain on break until school resumes Monday, January 7<sup>th</sup>, 2013.



#### A note from our School Nurse:

If your child requires prescribed medicine to be taken at lunch time, a school medical form signed by the student's doctor and you, must accompany the medicine (which needs to be in the proper bottle/box, this also includes inhalers). For over-the-counter medicines, the form only needs to be signed by the parent. Medical forms are kept in the office. We are not allowed to given any medicine to students without signed forms.

### **Snack and Treat Policy:**

Due to health concerns and scheduling, treats and snacks for any occasion must be arranged in advance with the classroom teacher. All treats and snacks must be store bought and prepackaged with nutritional information listed. Treats and snacks must not require refrigeration and must have a clearly printed list of ingredients on the packaging. No homemade treats, snacks or items from bakeries are allowed for distribution at school. We strongly encourage you to select a treat or snack with nutritional value. Snacks brought to school, that do not comply with this policy, will not be distributed to students. If you need to know how many students are in a classroom, please call the office at 343 0516. Also, remember that teachers do not have plates, plastic-ware or cups, so please keep it simple.

### **Changes to ISAT cut scores:**

ISBE has released new information regarding the upcoming ISAT tests in March. ISBE plans to significantly raise cut scores for the reading, math, and science test scores. These changes will make it more difficult for our students to be identified in the "Exceeds Standards" or "Meets Standards" category. This shift is to help us realize the rigor that is going to be necessary as we transition from the ISAT test to the new PARCC assessment.


